NEAS launches accessible fleet of ambulances

44 ambulances and 43 Patient Transport Service vehicles have been adapted to make them more accessible to disabled people, including people with sight and hearing impairments and people living with dementia. NEAS is the first ambulance service in the country to completely re-design some of their vehicles to meet the needs of all of these patients.

Among the changes are a new look interior, an improved colour scheme, better signs and handrails. The colour contrast between the walls, floor and cabinets has also been changed to improve access for patients.

The vehicles have been approved by the <u>Alzheimer's Society</u> as dementia friendly vehicles and the outside of the vehicles will display a sign indicating the new vehicles are dementia friendly spaces.

Carers Rights Day, 21 November 2019

Carers Rights Day is an annual awareness event run by <u>Carers UK</u>. It aims to reach as many of the 6.5 million carers in the UK as possible with information about their rights and the financial and practical help they are entitled to, including: benefits, such as <u>Carer's Allowance</u>, <u>Attendance allowance</u>, breaks and access to <u>equipment and technology</u> which can help them in their caring role. This year the charity is encouraging people to think about how caring might affect them now and in the future and what support they might need.

World Aids Day, 1st December

World Aids day is on 1st December each year and the symbol of support and to raise awareness is a red ribbon. This day offers an opportunity to unite in the fight against HIV, to show support for people living with HIV, and to commemorate those who have died from an AIDS-related illness. Over 101,600 people are living with HIV in the UK. Globally, there are an estimated 36.7 million people who have the virus. Despite the virus only being identified in 1984, more than 35 million people have died of HIV or AIDS, making it one of the most destructive pandemics in history.

Leading up to World Aids Day, the North East is the first area to hold a #letsnailHIVstigma campaign. EyesOpen are supported by Newcastle City Council, the NHS, Shine, MESMAC and Blue Sky Trust. The plan is to paint a nail red on Friday 29th November in schools and work places to encourage conversations about HIV - both how to protect yourself from the virus, and to remove the stigma attached to being diagnosed with it. - challenging ageist language, culture and practices

- can meet the demand for appropriate (secondary) places, including consideration of capital investment where appropriate
- develop effective channels to deliver early intervention with specialist support, as part of the city's agreed graduated response to support children and young people with special educational needs

- develop expertise in schools, settings and support services which will enable all settings to meet the needs of children and young people with ASD (autistic spectrum disorder) and SEMH (social, emotional and mental health) needs, including consideration of capital investment where appropriate
- address the gap in mental health support for young people aged 16+.

Keeping warm in Winter

Keeping warm is important as you are more likely to catch cold or flu in winter. The cold weather (below 8°C) can also cause other serious health problems such as heart attacks, stroke, hypothermia and pneumonia. It also increases the risk of accidents and falls. The cold can affect those with mental health or long term physical conditions and people aged 65 years and over.

Keep warm with hot drinks and hot food. Wear warm clothes and shoes, and aim to keep your home between 18°C and 21°C (or 64°F and 70°F) Information NOW has a series of articles that may help you this Winter:
