

Free meals and cheap food in Newcastle

There are free hot meals and takeaway food provided by volunteer and community groups in Newcastle. They welcome people who are hungry or lonely to eat a hot meal.

There are community meals and pay as you feel supermarkets or food pantries where you can buy low cost food. These often use food donated by companies where it would otherwise go to waste.

<u>Big River Bakery</u> offer baking classes Monday to Saturday. They crowdfund to support people in Newcastle with baking classes. You can also pay for classes.

<u>Nourish Food School</u> run a range of free cooking skills sessions and training courses for everyone. There is a small charge for some classes which helps to fund the service. They have hubs in Westerhope and Ouseburn.

West End Women and Girls Centre run a women's cookery club on Fridays.

Free or pay as you feel hot drinks

<u>BALTIC Centre for Contemporary Art, Gateshead</u> offers pay as you feel hot drinks and snacks, a picnic area, free Wi Fi and phone charging points in their Café area. It is a warm space where you can spend time for free.

<u>Ikea free tea or coffee</u> Monday to Friday Ikea Family Members can get a free hot drink in their restaurant. Show your card to claim the offer.

Supermarket discounts and offers

Discounts for older people

<u>Iceland</u>, is a supermarket that sells frozen food, gives a 10% discount to people over 60 years old on Tuesdays when buying food in store. To get the discount you need to show your: bus pass, Drivers License or Senior railcard at the till.

Asda in store café free porridge and hot drink for all customers in their cafes from February 7th to March 20th 2024.

Asda also offer a 'winter warmer deal' for people over 60 years old to help with the cost-of-living crisis. Buy soup, a roll and unlimited tea and coffees for £1 in any of its 205 cafes, all day and every day until the end of February 2024.

Discounts for children

Asda in store café £1 for any kids' meal at Asda Cafés. You don't have to buy an adult meal at the same time. You can get a free baby food pouch for babies under 18 months with any purchase. Over 60's get 10% off on Wednesdays.

<u>Ikea all kids' meals cost 95p or £1.50.</u> You pay 95p for a children's meal or £1.50 for the meal deal. The deal includes one hot meal, a jelly, a soft drink, and a piece of fruit.

Morrisons supermarket has a permanent 'kids eat free' offer at their instore café. To

get this offer you need to buy an adult meal which costs over £4.99.

Refill water bottles for free

Refill helps you to find places to refill your water bottle for free. There's over 300 places in Newcastle to get free tap water. Look out for the blue 'Refill' sticker in the shop window to see which shops are part of the Refill scheme. You can also find places to take your own containers for discounted take away coffee and food.

Support for families and children

If you receive certain benefits you can access additional food support for your children.

Healthy Start Scheme

The NHS Healthy Start Scheme is for people who are more than 10 weeks pregnant, or have children under the age of 4, who receive certain benefits. You get a free prepaid card that's topped up every 4 weeks to buy: milk, fruit and vegetables. You can also collect free vitamins from <u>locations listed here</u>. You can use the card in shops that accept Mastercard payments and sell at least one of these Healthy Start foods.

Free school meals

<u>Free school meals</u> are available to children whose parents receive certain benefits and are at:

- government funded schools, full time, up to the age of 19,
- or in a nursery class or nursery school and attending for full days.

The government has temporarily extended free school meals to families with no recourse to public funds during the coronavirus pandemic.

School holidays

Children who receive free school meals during term time because they're eligible, will receive up to £90 of food vouchers for the summer holidays. This will be arranged by the child's school. Newcastle City Council will contact those who are registered to receive free meals who don't have a school place.

Early years children (3 and 4 year olds in Newcastle) who receive a funded free early years entitlement for their place at either school, pre-school playgroup, day nursery or childminder. And meet the criteria for free school meals, should also be offered a food voucher by their early years provider.

Free holiday activities

Holiday Activities run the 'Newcastle Best Summer / Spring / Winter Ever'

schemes. The free school holiday activity scheme in Newcastle for 4 to 16 year olds. This support is for families who receive free school meals. Community organisations across Newcastle provide free activity sessions and a meal for your child. You can choose from a range of fun, educational and sociable activities such as: sport, art, and culture. Newcastle City Council and StreetGames are working with community partners to give children and young people in Newcastle a happy and enjoyable school holidays. Visit their website for more information about the activities available, where they're taking place and how to book.

Universal free school meals for Reception children, Year 1 and Year 2

Universal free school meals are available to all children in government funded schools in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2. You don't have to apply for universal free school meals and you do not have to receive benefits to be eligible for them. It is for all children aged 4 to 8 years old. This does not mean you are eligible for the school holiday vouchers. The vouchers are for children who meet the eligibility criteria for

free school meals mentioned above.

Please note: Your child and their school may be able to get extra help if you get one of the qualifying benefits for free school meals. **Apply for free school meals** so that the council can check if your child is eligible for the extra help, even if your child is in reception, year 1 or year 2.

Cost of living help and support from Newcastle City Council

Newcastle City Council's <u>Cost of Living website</u> has information about where to get help and support on a range of issues. This includes with:

- Benefits, debt, money and energy advice
- Housing support
- <u>Wellbeing Hubs</u>? a directory of places offer support. This includes community centres and libraries where people can go to stay warm while accessing free wi-fi, help and advice, learning new skills and taking part in activities such as cookery classes. You can also register your service as a Hub here.
- Help with school and learning costs, free childcare
- Council tax discounts and exemptions
- Crisis support and emergency funds

You can contact the <u>Cost of Living Helpline at Newcastle City Council</u> for help and support. You can complete their online form to ask for help or call the free helpline. They can signpost you to local help and support including:

- emergency food parcels
- <u>wellbeing hubs:</u> warm spaces in the local community where you can spend time and enjoy facilities such as Wi-Fi, hot drinks or food.
- help to mange your electricity or gas payments

Winter Wellbeing Hubs

Wellbeing Hubs are a warm welcoming place to spend time in Newcastle. Local venues, such as libraries and community centres, offer a range of support such as hot

drinks, free Wi-Fi, place to charge your devices, information, advice and more.

Homeless people

<u>The People's Kitchen</u> give free hot meals sleeping bags, warm clothing and toiletries to homeless and vulnerable people.

Joseph Cowen Healthcare Centre offer access to healthcare for people who are street homeless or in temporary accommodation who cannot access mainstream healthcare services. At these sessions you can access a doctor, bathing facilities and hot drinks.

The Cedarwood Trust is a community centre in the Meadow Well, North Shields. They run a range of community services including a low cost food shop called The Nourish Store. Members can join for £1. A weekly shop costs £4 and you get up to £15 worth of goods. You can pay an extra £1.50 for fresh fruit and vegetables
