

## Minor Injuries Units

### What is a Minor Injury Unit?

Minor Injuries Units are for patients with injuries such as sprains, cuts and grazes. The waiting times are generally much shorter than at Accident and Emergency, where staff have to give priority to serious and life-threatening conditions. You will see a nurse practitioner who is trained to assess and treat a wide range of minor injuries and ailments.

### When should I use a Minor Injury Unit?

You can use a minor injury unit if you have suffered a minor injury or ailment such as

#### Minor injuries:

- Shoulder injuries
- Elbow and below
- Knee and below
- Minor head injuries
- Facial injuries
- Cuts / bruises / sprains

#### Minor ailments:

- Earache
  - Aches and pains
  - Emergency contraception

### How Do I Use the Minor Injuries Unit?

[Royal Victoria Infirmary \(RVI\) Minor Injuries Unit](#) is the Minor Injuries Unit in Newcastle. You can go to the unit and use without an appointment. They are open from 8:00am to 9:00pm, 7 days a week.
