# InformationNOW 15th Birthday celebration

<u>InformationNOW</u> is celebrating its 15<sup>th</sup> birthday at the City Library on Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> December with the help of Radio Tyneside, a popular community radio station.

Taking place between 10 am and 12 noon, Kate, Lauren and the team from Radio Tyneside will be in conversation with people who were involved in the original design of the website, supporters of InformationNOW and partners across the voluntary sector involved in the use and promotion of the website.

We have the Bewick Hall for the occasion and Library customers will be able to listen to the show within the library building.

The Council's digital team and volunteers managed by Lisa Dawson will be on hand to show people how to access and use InformationNOW. Pui Lee, a freelance artist, will be inviting people to help create a concertina book and banner to commemorate the website and she has kindly been paid for by the Arts Development Officer at the Council.

If you are passing, pop in and help us create a fun and creative atmosphere. Recordings from the live show will be broadcast during the following week on Radio Tyneside each day.

For the last fifteen years, the website has been supported by Adult Social Care at Newcastle City Council and Newcastle Gateshead Clinical Commissioning Group. The concept and design were developed through the Quality of Life Partnership and the Elders Council of Newcastle and the website has grown from strength to strength, from offering information and a directory of organisations, to including a wide range of community events which are accessible to all.

Library social distancing and mask wearing rules will apply as advised on the day.

# International Day of Elimination of Violence Against Women or White Ribbon Day

Thursday was International Day of Elimination of Violence Against Women or White Ribbon Day as it's more commonly known. This year the theme is All Men Can because, when it comes to ending male violence against women and girls, all men and boys can make a difference. If you live in Newcastle and have a learning disability or you care for someone with a learning disability, HealthwatchNewcastle would love to hear from you.

People with a learning disability often have poorer physical and mental health. An annual health check can improve health by spotting problems earlier.

Healthwatch Newcastle is gathering experiences of annual health checks for people in Newcastle with a learning disability. They're working with city-based organisations supporting people with a learning disability and their carers and are also running two online surveys (the deadline to respond is Friday 14 January 2022).

# World Aids Day, 1st December

World Aids day is on 1st December each year and the symbol of support and to raise awareness is a red ribbon. This day offers an opportunity to unite in the fight against HIV, to show support for people living with HIV and to commemorate those who have died from an AIDS-related illness. Over 101,600 people are living with HIV in the UK. Globally, there are an estimated 36.7 million people who have the virus. Despite the virus only being identified in 1984, more than 35 million people have died of HIV or AIDS, making it one of the most destructive pandemics in history.

The Eyes Open Steering Group was established in the North East of England in 2003 as a way of regionally pooling resources to widen and strengthen the impact of work at both local and regional levels regarding HIV/AIDS; they now also cover Cumbria, the objectives of Eyes Open are:

- to guide the delivery of educational initiatives.
- to develop community events to raise awareness in the general population.
- to cooperate and work with individuals, voluntary organisations, and statutory authorities to raise awareness, increase understanding and reduce onward transmission.

The plan is to paint a nail red in schools and work places to encourage conversations about HIV – both how to protect yourself from the virus, and to remove the stigma attached to being diagnosed with it.
