

Eye Casualty

Eye casualty departments provide care for patients who have any eye conditions that can't be treated by a GP or at a <u>Minor Injuries Unit</u>. Patients are treated by doctors, nurse specialists and optometrists. Priority is given to patients with sight-threatening conditions.

What kind of treatment can I get at Eye Casualty?

Eye casualty departments treat a variety of problems including:

- Foreign bodies and abrasions
- Conjunctivitis
- Corneal ulcers
- Painful eyes
- Loss of vision
- Accidents/injuries
- Visual disturbances

- Eye Clinic Liaison Service is based at the Royal Victoria Infirmary (RVI). They can offer
 emotional support, advice and information at any stage of sight loss. You don't need to be
 referred from another health professional and you don't necessarily need an appointment. You
 may also be referred to other services.
