Help to plan your trip to Newcastle City Centre

[How Busy Is Toon ?](#) gives you information to help understand how busy the buses, roads and city centre is. So you feel safe and prepared when planning to visit Newcastle city centre. Visit the website to see:

- Street images of: Northumberland Street, Grey Street, Barrack Road and Blakett Street, updated every 5 minutes
- Images of key roads into the city, updated every 15 minutes
- A real-time map showing the location of every bus operating across Newcastle, searchable by route number
- Car park spaces available
- Up-to-date traffic and travel information
- Information on Electric vehicle (EV) charging locations
- Walking and cycling routes to help you plan your journey

If you are cycling in the city centre you can see [bike parking spaces available from Newcastle city council](#)

If you are travelling by Metro or Ferry with young children, up to three kids aged 11 and under can travel for free on Metro and the Shields ferry all day when accompanied by a fare paying adult over the age of 18.

Check the accessibility of the venue before you visit

AccessAble can help you to plan your trips to places like cinemas, theatres, restaurants, railway stations, hotels and more. They visit and review the accessibility of places in Newcastle. Use their directory of venues to find wheelchair friendly venues, read more about facilities and disabled access available. Such as:

- photos of the facilities
- entrance to the building
- accessible toilets or changing places
- how easy it is to move around the venue
- lifts
- transport and parking
- dementia friendly
- quiet or safe space
- sign language
