

Your benefits while you are in hospital or in residential care

Some benefits are affected when you go into hospital or residential care. This means the payment will stop or the amount you get changes.

What to do when you're going into hospital or residential care

1. Tell whoever pays your benefit the date of your admission before you go into care or hospital so they can make changes to your payment. This may be [Jobcentre Plus](#), the [Pension Service](#), [Department for work and pensions \(DWP\)](#) or [Newcastle City Council Tax](#).
2. If you can't do this, let them know as soon as possible afterwards.
3. Let the people paying the benefit know when you return home, even if no benefits were stopped while you were away.
