Places to visit with children

Alnwick Garden

[Alnwick Garden](#) was created with children in mind and has many activities for them to enjoy, including driving miniature tractors, or visiting the Poison Garden or The Treehouse, where they can play on the rope bridges.

BALTIC Centre for Contemporary Art

[BALTIC Centre for Contemporary Art](#) have new art exhibitions and a range of **free** activities for children and families. They have a permanent interactive play space. They offer drop-in art activities for children under 13 years old and their families every Saturday and Sunday between 2pm and 4pm. They have a picnic area and free refreshments available. **Admission is free.**

Discovery Museum

[Discovery Museum](#) has a water play area called Play Tyne which allows children under 7 to experience the workings of the River Tyne, including shipbuilding, loading cranes etc. **Admission is free.** It also has a range of interactive exhibitions and a small soft play area.

Laing Art Gallery

[Laing Art Gallery](#) has an Under Five's Area where young children can learn about art through play. The area has games and puzzles as well as a dressing up box. **Admission is free.** Please note it is closed on Mondays apart from Bank Holidays.

Life (previously known as the Centre for Life or Life Science Centre)

[Life Science Centre \(previously known as the Centre for Life\)](#) is a lively experience which aims to encourage questions about the world we live in. Attractions include interactive science exhibitions and live demonstrations. **There is a cost for this.**

The Glasshouse International Centre for Music

[The Glasshouse International Centre for Music](#) has a programme of activities for children, such as music making and Movers and Shakers. They also have a range of family-friendly events. There is a small play space on the ground floor which is free to access. **There is usually a cost to watch shows but some activities and entrance are free.**

Seven Stories – The Centre for Children's Books

[Seven Stories – The Centre for Children's Books](#) is an exhibition space dedicated to the celebration of British children's literature. Exhibitions change regularly. There is also a bookshop, storytelling and weekend and holiday drop-in family activities. Admission charges apply.

The Shipley Art Gallery

[The Shipley Art Gallery](#) has a range of activities for children and babies including 'Creative Baby' a sensory baby activity. They offer, free of charge, interactive resources for babies and families to use whilst visiting the gallery. You can borrow a 'Magic Carpet' made by artists, these special bags fold out into creative playmats, complete with a selection of toys. You can also borrow a 'Shipley Explorer' pack to enjoy with young children anywhere in the gallery. Donations welcome, admission free.

Libraries
