

Help with energy problems and how to pay for them

As energy costs increase you may be struggling to pay your bills. Upgrading your heating system or insulating your home can help to reduce your energy costs. Help is available to arrange and pay for this.

Help to pay heating bills and energy debt

If you are struggling to pay your fuel bills or to need help with the cost of heating and insulation improvements to your home, help is available.

Citizens Advice Newcastle have an Energy Affordability Helpline. They can help you to get an emergency fuel voucher. They provide energy advice to anyone in Newcastle. They can help you to register with the Priority Services register, pay your bills and more.

Energy Services, Newcastle City Council can give telephone advice about your energy use, how to reduce fuel bills, and how to keep warm.

Charis Grants manage financial assistance on behalf of a number of energy suppliers.

Where to get energy advice

Help with prepayment energy costs

If your prepayment meters are about to run out of credit and you don't have any funds to top up, you need to contact your energy supplier.

Your supplier should be able to issue a credit voucher or extend your emergency credit.

If your supplier tells you that they won't help, then you can ask the [Citizens Advice Extra Help Unit](#) to speak to them on your behalf:

Warm Home Discount Scheme

[**The Warm Home Discount Scheme**](#) provides a £150 discount on your electricity bill to people who are eligible. Visit their website to find out if you meet the criteria.

This discount doesn't affect your Cold Weather or Winter Fuel Payment.

Winter Fuel and Cold Weather Payments

These schemes are for older people to help pay their energy bills during the colder months.

Threatened with Disconnection?

If you are threatened with disconnection because you can't pay your fuel bills, you should contact the energy company straightaway. It is likely that something can be done to help you. Your options might include:

- making an arrangement with the energy company to repay your debts
- being offered a pre-payment meter as an alternative to disconnection
- [**use your benefits payments**](#) to help pay your bills and avoid disconnection. Some of your benefit will be deducted every week and will be paid directly to your energy supplier.

Benefits advice in Newcastle

It can be useful to speak with someone about the benefits you may be entitled to and how they may impact upon your other benefits. A local independent advice service can help guide you through the process such as:

[**Newcastle Welfare Rights Service**](#) provide advice to people in priority groups including those over 65. They have [**self-help material**](#) on their website.

Help for individuals and families from charities

Some charities help people in financial need. You can search them for charities that can help you in various circumstances.

Turn2us is a charity where you find charitable funds and grants to apply for, when you need money for essential things in life. For example, furniture, household items, white goods, electrical items, studying, bringing up children, experiencing life changing circumstances and more. They have a telephone helpline, benefits calculator and online information.

Community Foundation have a variety of grants available to apply for, available to individuals and organisations. You can use their online grant finder to see the grants that are available at the moment. These grants are usually available to help improve health, wellbeing and education opportunities for people in the North East.
