

Food banks and free emergency food in Newcastle

If you are struggling to afford to eat, food banks or charities may be able to help. There are places that give free food or food vouchers to people who need it most in Newcastle.

What is a Food bank?

Food banks give emergency food parcels to people who are in crisis. They are usually run by volunteers. You will need to be referred to a Food Bank by an agency and given a food bank voucher. There are places in Newcastle where you can get a food parcel in an emergency. Emergency food parcels usually contain dried or tinned food that you can cook at home to make meals.

Foodbanks support both individuals and families who are struggling. They often offer other items such as: nappies, baby milk, period products, toiletries and pet food.

Making a donation to a food bank

Food banks are ran by charities and voluntary groups. They welcome donations. You can often donate food that you have bought at a supermarket at drop off points near the checkouts. Please check with the food bank to see what kind of donations they need. They may prefer donations of:

- money
- essential food items: Food banks usually have a list of food items that they need most. Such as long life milk, food in tins, dried food, teabags and coffee.
- online food shopping delivered directly to their centre at a set time
- supermarket vouchers

Wellbeing Hubs

Wellbeing Hubs are warm welcoming place to spend time in Newcastle. Local venues, such as libraries and community centres, offer a range of support such as hot drinks, free wifi, place to charge your devices, information, advice and more.
