

Food help in Newcastle

If you can't afford to buy or cook food for yourself or family, help is available. Read more below to find local services, charities and community groups who can help and low cost options to help make your money go further.

Emergency food parcels

[Foodbanks in Newcastle](#) give emergency food parcels to people who are in crisis. They are usually run by volunteers. Emergency food parcels usually contain dried or tinned food that you can cook at home to make meals. You may need a referral from a professional to get a voucher and get a parcel. Foodbanks support both individuals and families who are struggling. They often offer other items such as: nappies, baby milk, period products, toiletries and pet food.

Free meals and cheap food

Healthy Start Scheme

[NHS Healthy Start Scheme](#) is for people who are more than 10 weeks pregnant, or have children under the age of 4, who receive certain benefits. You get a free prepaid card that's topped up every 4 weeks to buy: milk, fruit and vegetables. You can also collect free vitamins from [locations listed here](#).

You can use the card in shops that accept Mastercard payments and sell at least one of these Healthy Start foods.
