Falls Prevention Week

Monday 21 September to Friday 25 September 2026

Newcastle Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust will be hosting a series of events during Falls Awareness Week. This year's theme is "**Right Care, Right Place, Right Time.**"

Falls are not an inevitable part of ageing. However, they can have a significant impact on a person's confidence, independence and quality of life, and are one of the leading reasons for hospital admissions among older people. Many falls can be prevented through awareness, appropriate support and early intervention.

Working in partnership with NHS services, Newcastle City Council, charities and private organisations, we will be providing falls prevention advice, signposting to local services, raising awareness of falls risk and offering walking aid MOTs.
